Pete's First Bike Trip—1983



The riders were Ed on a Suzuki 1100, Robert on a Suzuki 400(Ed's old bike) and me on a Suzuki 600g(my first bike). All of us worked for IBM and were living in Bedford Texas at the time. Bob and I were new to motorcycling and didn't have much in the way of gear or luggage. I bought some soft sided bags for the trip. On a fine spring day the 3 of us headed west on I 20 for about 430 miles. The longest and furthest I had ever been on a bike and my butt knew it. The next morning we went to Balmorhea State Park and the clearest lake water I have ever seen. Our next stop was Fort Davis National Historic Site. What we thought odd about the location of the fort was it had great views of any Indians coming from the front but the back was built into a very high ridge. It would have been very easy to get on top the ridge to attack the fort but that did not happen. On our way back to our motel we rode down a couple of switch backs. Bob stops in the middle of the road for what I don't know. Ed and I pull off at the bottom about 30 yards from Bob. Bob picks up something but we can't tell what. Bob finally makes his way to where Ed and I are and informs us he stopped to get a tarantula off the road. Bob was a Marine and while stationed at 29 Palms playing with tarantulas was quite common. We spent the night out around Marfa literally by the side of the road. Ed or Bob, not sure which now, said we need to see the lights of Marfa. It turns out they don't show up every night and you guessed it they did not when we were there. To this day I don't know if the lights of Marfa are real or something from some ones imagination. Each night we would get one room with two double beds to keep costs down. Each night one of us would get to sleep solo while the other two shared. When it was Ed's turn for solo Bob and I get the bright idea to jump in bed with Ed. We did and Ed didn't not know how to react. I do believe he thought we were going to do something.

Following morning we headed through Alpine on our way to Big Bend National Park. The road from Alpine to Big Bend had exactly one gas station/quick mart. Other then that store we did not see one other building of any kind. We did stop at the store. Bob starts combing his hair once he gets his helmet off. He hears some one say 'it won't to move the lever to reserve the motor had help'. He looks over at me and I immediately say it came from inside the store. We go in the store and a conversation begins about where we are from and where we are going. So we tell him we are on our way to Big Bend. A female comes in with a new bandage on her upper right arm. Bob asked how she got the wound. She was on her way home when she spots a big buck in her path. As she reaches for her bow and arrow the arrow pierces her upper arm. We asked if she got the buck and the answer was yes then she went and got stitched up. We decide this is not a lady to mess with.

We make it to the entrance to Big Bend. There is supposed to be a motel somewhere in what is known as the basin. All I could see was a whole lot of nothing. As we are riding along I am seeing sticks/ poles on the sides of the road with numbers on them. I didn't have a clue as to the reason for them but by the 5th one the light came on. The poles were in low spots in the road and the numbers showed you how many feet of water there was in the gully caused by flash floods. Thirty seven miles from the park entrance we get to the the motel that is in the park. The ride up into the basin is great. Think of it as a volcano where you ride up the outside then crest the top and ride down the inside. I quit leading after the third time going or coming because all manner of beasts kept crossing the road right in front of me. Not the best way to learn emergency braking. Our first night at the lodge we go for dinner. The place was basically empty. Bob orders liver and onions which neither Ed nor I can stand so we move to another table. Bob swears he will never order liver and onions while we are around again. [Editor Note—I like Liver & Onions with mustard]

We spent the next two days riding around in the park. If you have never been to Big Bend put it on your bucket list.



We took the southern route east stopping at Judge Roy Beans saloon the Jersey Lilly in Langtry Tx. then on to Del Rio. heading back towards Bedford. While we were on I35 heading north with me bringing up the rear my bike started to stall. By the time I realized I needed quit. I roll to the shoulder move the lever and fire the bike back up. Neither Ed nor Bob saw me pull off so they kept going. They did finally exit the highway in an effort to find me. I was riding fast to catch back up with them after stopping to fill the tank. I didn't find them and they didn't find me. I rode the rest of the way home alone. I went straight to Bob s house. They had not gotten there yet. The fact I showed up without Bob did not make his wife happy. I told her what happened and they should be along shortly. I went home to my then wife. About an hour later Bob called to let me know they were home.

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
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Out & About by Al Jones President's Log—Final Entry—January 2012

From the South:

There is no access to the eastbound Johnson County rest stop while riding westbound. The closest entrance onto eastbound I40, is at NC 210 exit 319. This is about 9.7 miles west of I95.
